 Close lid after use

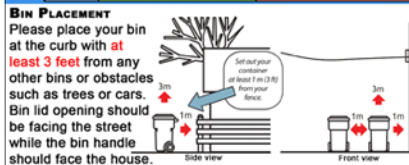
Paper <p>Newspapers, Magazines, Pizza Boxes, Cereal Boxes, Pylons Egg Cartons, Paper Towel Rolls, Telephone Books</p>	Glass <p>Clear and Coloured Glass Food and Beverage Containers with lids and/or labels</p>
Plastic <p>Wide Mouth Tube, Rigid Screw-Top Containers with caps, Grocery and retail bags</p>	Metal <p>Aluminum and Steel Beverage and Food Cans, Empty Aerosol Containers and Empty Paint Cans, All Metal Lids</p>

RECYCLING INFORMATION

DO NOT bag recyclables - except plastic bags
 DO NOT tie recyclables together
 Keep lid closed when not in use to keep water out
 Do not compact materials to ensure complete ejection
 Deposit only clean acceptable materials
 Do not place hazardous materials or hot ashes in the cart
 Wash out periodically with water
 Remove from curb after service
 Do not place bin on an elevated platform, bin might fall off
 Do not place bin on a steep slope - bin may roll away
 Do not tilt or roll container with the lid open
 Do not place sand, soil, or other heavy materials in the bin
 Do not overload this container (max. load 220 lbs or 100 kg)

Screw Top Container	All screw top containers marked: Rigid Plastic Containers, all containers and prescription medicine containers	All screw top containers marked: And all unmarked containers.
Wide Mouth Tubes	All wide mouth tubes marked: 	Tubs over 18 litres or any tubs with handles Food trays used for fruits, vegetables, prepared salads, cookies, muffins, fast food, and individual pudding cups. Any microplastic trays or plates.
Plastic Film	Clean and dry plastic film marked: Rough textured film, stretch wrap, any film that rolls into contact with itself	All plastic film clearly marked: And all unmarked film.
