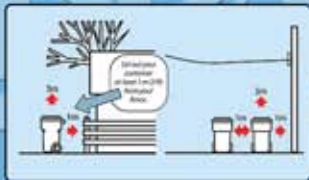


# Set Out Guide

## 1 Proper Set Out Guide



Please place your bin at the curb with at least 3 feet from any other bins or obstacles. The bin lid opening should be facing the street while the bin handle should face the house.

## 2 Helpful Setout Tips



- \* Put your materials out by 7:00am
- \* Place on the proper side of the road
- \* Do not place bin on the road
- \* Do not place in front of a mailbox
- \* The bin must be visible from the road
- \* Do not place on a snowbank
- \* Do not leave your cart lid open
- \* Do not put your bin on the sidewalk

## 2 Helpful Set Out Tips



- \* Put your materials out by 7:00am
- \* Place on the proper side of the road
- \* Do not place blue box on the road
- \* Do not place in front of a mailbox
- \* The box must be visible from the road
- \* Do not place on a snowbank
- \* Have a garbage tag on your bags
- \* No overweight garbage (45lbs)
- \* No oversized garbage (30 gallons)

## How to prepare your materials:

- Clean off bits of food and other residue.
- Place all recyclables in the container – no sorting is required.
- It's okay to leave labels on metal food cans, glass bottles, plastic containers, etc.
- Remove plastic lids and caps, dispose if smaller than 3", and place metal lids inside the can.
- Remove plastic wrapping from newspapers, magazines and catalogues.
- Material shouldn't be in bags, with two exceptions:
  - Bundle plastic bags, wrap into one plastic bag and tie handles.
  - Place shredded paper in a clear plastic bag and tie handles.

# Acceptable

## Plastic

- Clean rigid plastic containers labelled with the recycling symbol 1-7 (not Styrofoam™).
- Liquid detergent, fabric softener and shampoo bottles, plastic clamshell trays (not Styrofoam™), yogurt and margarine containers.
- Plastic lids that have a recycling symbol 1-7.
- Plastic retail shopping bags. Bundle into one plastic bag and tie handles.



## Paper and cardboard

- Newspapers and paper inserts (not tied in bundles).
- Catalogues and magazines (with plastic wrapping removed).
- Paper (e.g., letters, envelopes, brochures, paper bags).
- Cardboard and Boxboard (e.g., cereal boxes, pizza boxes, tissue boxes, paper towel tubes and toilet paper tubes).
- Telephone books and paperback books.
- Shredded paper (must be in a clear plastic bag with tied handles).
- Cartons (e.g. aseptic containers like juices boxes, polycoated containers such as milk and ice cream cartons).

## Metal food cans and foil

- Clean metal food cans.
- Metal lids and caps.
- Clean aluminum foil, aluminum foil plates and containers.



## Glass

- Clean jars and bottles.



Place these items in your recycling bin or community depot.
