# New Wheelie Bins

The new automated collection system uses a specialized vehicle to collect the new wheelie bins that are being distributed. For that reason, you cannot use your new bins until we start using the new vehicles to collect beginning the first week in July. Note that the recycling and waste bins may not be delivered at the same time.

Waste and recyclables will be collected at the same time with the same vehicle in a two compartment truck. We recommend that you set out both containers by 7 AM to ensure collection. Collection will take place on both sides of the road. Place your bin(s) where the delivery crew has placed them or where the driver leaves them after collection.



## Waste & Recycling Container Option Chart

### YOUR WASTE, YOUR CHOICE

We offer three different sizes for waste, each with a different fee. You have two options for the recycling containers and they have no fees attached. You can view them on display at the municipal office. You select the size that would fulfill your regular needs with some room for occasional variations. By default, you will receive a small waste and large recycling.



**SMALL BIN**  
 Capacity: 35 Gallons (120 litres)  
 Bag Equivalent: Up to 2 Bags  
 Dimensions: 39" x 20" x 23"  
 Maximum Weight: 120 lbs  
 Waste Fee: \$110 per year

**MEDIUM BIN**  
 Capacity: 65 Gallons (240 litres)  
 Bag Equivalent: Up to 4 Bags  
 Dimensions: 41" x 27" x 28"  
 Maximum Weight: 220 lbs  
 Waste Fee: \$185 per year



**LARGE BIN**  
 Capacity: 95 Gallons (360 litres)  
 Bag Equivalent: Up to 6 Bags  
 Dimensions: 45" x 29" x 34"  
 Maximum Weight: 320 lbs  
 Waste Fee: \$270 per year



Starting **Wednesday July 3rd** the Automated Collection Truck will begin collecting the new "Wheelie" Bins in Oil Springs. Using the new bins is as easy as **1-2-3!**

### 1 Collect.

Collect all your materials inside your home!  
**TIP:** Gather your recyclable materials using your blue box. See the lid of your new bin for acceptable materials. Use small kitchen catcher type bags around the house to capture waste where ever it is generated.



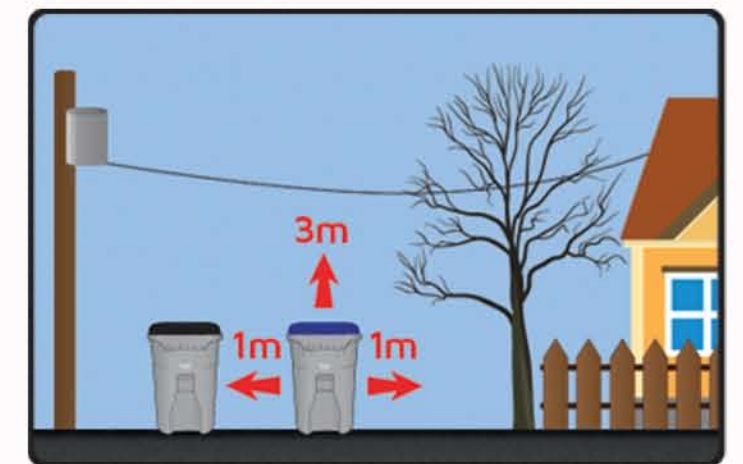
### 2 Empty.

Empty the blue box contents into the Blue recycling bin.  
 Place your kitchen catcher bags directly in the Black waste bin.  
**TIP:** Place all the recyclable items loose in the bin. Do not bag or tie anything to help us separate better with the exception of plastic bags and shredded paper which should be bagged before being placed in the bin. Trash may be bagged in bags if you wish.



### 3 Set Out.

Set out your "wheelie" bins at the road when full (or almost)  
**TIP:** The "wheelie" bins should be placed at least **3 feet away from any other objects** with the wheels and handle pointing towards the house and the lid opening towards the road. The truck arm can reach up to 12 feet. Collection is done on both sides of the road, where possible. No bag tags needed. **Collection will now occur every Wednesday year round.**



**Collection Changes (effective July 3rd)**  
 Your collection will now be **Wednesdays**. Your collection frequency will remain **weekly** year round for both waste and recycling. Where possible, collection will be on **both sides of the street**. Bag tags are no longer required for waste collection after June 30th. The new **subscription fee** will appear on your tax bill.

## Hazardous Waste

The County of Lambton operates a Household Hazardous Waste depot at the Clean Harbors Site. HHW Days take place at the Clean Harbors Canada Inc. site, 4090 Telfer Road in St. Clair Township the last Saturdays of March, April, May, June, September, and October.

- Batteries (household, rechargeable, automotive)
- Household cleaners, such as bleach & oven cleaner
- Energy efficient bulbs, fluorescent tubes/bulbs
- Hair dye, nail polish, nail polish remover
- Paints, varnish, solvents,
- Caulking, glue
- Fuels, antifreeze,
- Brake fluid
- Used motor oil
